D - wounded in right ankle and captured December 17, 1864, at Franklin, Tennessee; admitted to Hospital #1, Nashville, Tennessee, February 10, 1865, due to smallpox; sent to Louisville, Kentucky; released upon taking oath of allegiance, June 16, 1865; Hair: light; eyes: blue; complexion: fair; height: 5' 7"

C, "The Mississippi Rebels of Noxubee County" – wounded in the right shoulder, November 30, 1864, at Franklin, Tennessee; captured there December 17, 1864; admitted to Hospital #1, Nashville, Tennessee; on April 3, 1865, sent to camp Chase Prison, Ohio; released on taking oath of allegiance June 13, 1865

**Doolittle, William E.** – Sergeant – Co. D, "The Choctaw Rough and Readies" – wounded November 30, 1864, at Franklin, Tennessee; captured there December 17, 1864; sent to Fort Delaware, Delaware; exchanged February 27, 1865

**Hodges, Samuel J.** – Sergeant – Co. E, "The McNair Rifles" – captured as a convalescent, December 17, 1864, at Franklin, Tennessee; admitted to Hospital #1, Nashville, Tennessee; sent to camp Chase Prison, Ohio

**London, A.R.** – Private – Co. F, "The Tippah Highlanders" – captured December 17, 1864, at Franklin, Tennessee; sent to Camp Chase Prison, Ohio; released June 13, 1865

**Miles, James J.** – Private – Co. B, “The Insurgents of Itawamba County” – wounded November 30, 1864, at Franklin, Tennessee; captured there December 17, 1864; on January 6, 1865, sent to Camp Chase Prison, Ohio; released June 13, 1865

**Pittman, H.R.** – Private – Co. E, “The McNair Rifles” – wounded November 30, 1864, at Franklin, Tennessee; captured there, December 17, 1864; sent to camp Chase Prison, Ohio; exchanged from Point Lookout, Maryland, March, 1865

**Spencer, William L.C.** – Private – Co. F, “The Tippah Highlanders” – wounded November 30, 1864, at Franklin, Tennessee; captured there December 17, 1864; sent to Camp Chase Prison, Ohio; sent to Point Lookout, Maryland and released from there May 13, 1865

**Swindle, Joel** – Private – Co. C, “The Mississippi Rebels of Noxubee County” – captured December 17, 1864, at Franklin, Tennessee; sent to Camp Chase Prison, Ohio; released January 9, 1865

**Thomas, John** – Private – Co. D, “The Choctaw Rough and Readies” – captured December 17, 1864;

**Towers, John** – Private – Co. D, “The Choctaw Rough and Readies” – captured December 17, 1864; sent to Camp Chase Prison, Ohio

**Varnado, Felix H.** – Color Corporal – Co. E, “The McNair Rifles” – captured December 17, 1864, at Franklin, Tennessee; sent to Camp Chase Prison, Ohio

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Tennessee Cavalry:

**Francis, C.C. (“Dick”)** – Private – Co. C – “...he was the only member of Company C who was captured.” December 17, 1864, at Holly Tree Gap

**Knott, Tom** – Private – Co. B – “captured” December 17, 1864, at Holly Tree Gap

**McRae, F.M.** – Lieutenant – Co. K – “... at Holly Tree Gap... After making a gallant defense – emptying both his revolvers – Lieutenant F.M. McRae, who was in command of Company K, surrendered, and was afterward shot through the right shoulder by a drunken coward.”

**McRae, T.F.** – Private (?) – Co. ? – “was knocked from his horse with a carbine and captured” December 17, 1864, at Holly Tree Gap

(note: *Tennesseans in the Civil War* lists the following, only: “C.C. Francis, Pvt., Co. C, 22<sup>nd</sup> Tn. Cav. [Barteaue’s]”; “Thomas L. Knott, Sgt. Maj., Co. B, 22<sup>nd</sup> Tn. Cav.”; no “F.M. or T.F. McRae”, by that spelling)

**Poindexter, William J.** – Private – Co. D – captured December 17, 1864, at Franklin, Tennessee; sent to Camp Chase Prison, Ohio; died March 15, 1865 of pneumonia; buried there

**Norvell, Joseph S.** – Private – Co. B – captured December 17, 1864, at Franklin, Tennessee

**Hobson, Volney** – Captain – (Cadiz, Henry County, Indiana) – Co. E – killed beneath the Railroad trestle on Liberty Pike, north of Franklin, Tennessee on the morning of the 17<sup>th</sup>; buried: Batson Cemetery, Henry County, Indiana

**Lewis, Duane A.** – Private – (Fortville, Indiana) – Co. B – killed at Hollow Tree Gap

**Macy, Henry B.** – Private – (Dalton, Indiana) – Co. C – mortally wounded at Franklin, Tennessee; died March 9, 1865, at Nashville, Tennessee

**Parsons, Adrian** – Private – Co. I – severely wounded December 17, 1864, at West Harpeth, Tennessee; admitted to Hospital #8, Nashville, Tennessee

**Ricks, Benjamin F.** – Private – (Cadiz, Henry County, Indiana) – Co. E – killed at West Harpeth, Tennessee

**Watts, James S.** – Private – (Hendricks County, Indiana) – Co. I – killed at Franklin, Tennessee, buried: Franklin section; grave #445; Stones River National Cemetery, Murfreesboro, Tennessee

**Wine, J.** – Private – Co. C – age 44 – wounded in left thigh December 17, 1864; leg was amputated the same day (anterior post. flap), by Asst. Surgeon J.R. Culbertson, 10<sup>th</sup> Indiana Cavalry; discharged May 15, 1865

**Banta, William J.** – (Switzerland County, Indiana) – Private – Co. D – captured December 17, 1864

**Ezell, Timothy** – Private – Co. E – killed December 17, 1864

**Howington, Polk** – Private – (Clarke County, Indiana) – Co. E – mortally wounded (no place listed); died at New Albany, Indiana (no date listed) - Buried: section B, grave #288, New Albany National Cemetery, New Albany, Indiana

**Jones, James T.** – (Gibson County, Indiana) - Private – Co. K – captured; survived the SULTANA

**Jones, Thomas** – (Posey County, Indiana) - Private – Co. A – killed December 17, 1864

**Langwell, Malcom** – (Switzerland County, Indiana) – Private – Co. D – captured December 17, 1864

**Loyd, Henry W.** – (Gibson County, Indiana) – Private – Co. missing December 17, 1864

**Northerland, Marion** – (Posey County, Indiana) – Private – Co. K – mortally wounded December 17, 1864; died later (no date)

**Stockings, Chester L.** – Private – (Pike County, Indiana) – Co. F – killed at Holly Tree Gap, Tennessee

**2<sup>nd</sup> Iowa Cavalry:**

**Anderson, William H.H.** – (Burlington, Illinois) - Private – Co. K – severely wounded at West Harpeth; mustered out June 9, 1865 – “*William Anderson escaped from a hand to hand encounter with an officer, with the loss of one eye.*”

**Bennett Horace** – (Okobodji, Illinois) - Private – Co. I – captured at West Harpeth; escaped back to Federals December 18, 1864; mustered out September 19, 1865

**Black, Dominic** – (Iowa City, Iowa) - Private – Co.
